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5: SAFETY REGULATIONS

5.1 Students should be responsible for their own personal belongings & valuable items. Passports will be kept by teachers during the entire trip.

5.2 Students should avoid interactions initiated by strangers unless it is intended in activities of the tour.

5.3 Students must bring their own medicines. Teachers will NOT supply any medicines under any circumstances. In case of emergency, the student will purchase the medicine(s) they need in the presence of a teacher & the local tour guide.

5.4 Students should report any illness or injuries to teachers immediately.

5.5 Students must bring & manage their cash or bank cards. Teachers will NOT lend students any money.

5.6 Students must not leave the team or any activities during the entire trip.

5.7 Students must not leave the floor they are assigned to after 10:30 p.m. unless accompanied by a teacher for emergencies.

5.8 Students must identify emergency exits & escape routes in the hotel upon arrival.

5.9 If you find yourself lost or separated from the group, STAY exactly where you are. DO NOT leave your location unless there is immediate danger. Call any of the teachers immediately.

- 6.2 Respect & appreciate local customs & social norms.
- 6.3 Be helpful & cooperative when working with others.
- 6.4 Be punctual for all activities.
- 6.5 Use polite language at all times.
- 6.6 Keep your noise at a reasonable level, especially at night.
- 6.7 Keep your room & any place you visit clean & tidy.
- 6.8 Look out for your fellow schoolmates/roommates.

6.9 Report any illnesses, injuries & disputes to a teacher as soon as possible.

6.10 Behave yourself at all times. Do not attempt to do any inappropriate behaviours (e.g. drinking, smoking, speaking foul language, etc.) both in and out of the hotel, plus in public places.
